You have been selected to Statistics Finland's inquiry on safety and well-being in Finland

The survey collects important information about everyday safety of people living in Finland. The questions concern life in the family, at work and during free time.

Statistics are compiled from the received responses. The results will be utilised in planning measures to promote the safety and well-being of Finnish residents and to support decision-making. **Your participation is important regardless of how safe or unsafe you feel in your everyday life.**

The inquiry is part of a larger research project financed by Eurostat, the Statistical Office of the European Union, measuring everyday safety in various European countries. As regards Finland, the survey is conducted by Statistics Finland, the government statistical office, whose task it is to compile statistics and conduct surveys describing conditions in society.

It is easy to respond

- There is no need to prepare in advance for responding. The questions concern your experiences.
- Respond to the survey on the web (by computer, tablet or phone). A link to the web form and your personal identifiers can be found in the box at the top of the letter.
- If you do not have access to the Internet, you can take part in the survey by filling in a paper form. You can order and return the paper form free of charge. You can order the form by telephone (tel. +358 29 551 2222, weekdays 12:00–15:00).

You are irreplaceable as a respondent

A total of 25,000 persons aged 16 to 74 were selected at random to the survey. You are one of them. In the survey you represent persons in your age group and living in your area, and no one else can replace you.

We ensure that your data are protected

We handle your responses in a confidential manner. Statistics Finland's employees are obliged to secrecy. We use the data you have given for compiling national and international statistics.

It is not possible to identify persons having participated in the survey from the statistical data.

Grounds for processing personal data

Public interest as intended in the EU's General Data Protection Regulation.

Data to be combined with the collected data

To make responding easier and enable versatile research use of statistical data, the collected data can be supplemented with register data from different periods of time.

The following data can be combined to the collected data: the respondents' and their other household members' age, registered sex, marital status, family, residence and place of residence data, education and qualification data, income, benefit and employment data, occupation and workplace data, job search data, tax and wealth data, mother tongue, nationality and country of birth, health and health care data, social welfare data, data of the police and courts on reports of offences, investigations, legal proceedings and sentences, and data on future cause and year of death. Unfinished answers can also be utilised in the data.
